Michael Wimmer, Deputy Head of Division, International Labour and Social Policy, Federal Ministry of Labour and Social Affairs (BMAS), Germany

Dr. Michael Wimmer, born 26 of March 1960, studied Biology at Johann Wolfgang Goethe Universität Frankfurt/Germany and acquired a doctorate in Microbiology, Biochemistry and Humangenetics/Anthropology. Beginning in 1988 he worked for 3 years as a forensic scientist in the head office of the Hessen State Criminal Office in Wiesbaden (LKA). Summer 1991 he joined the Department for Occupational Safety and Health in the Federal Ministry for Labour and Social Affairs in Bonn. Until 1996 he served in several units as a desk officer and later deputy head of division working mainly on regulations regarding occupational hazards from chemicals and biological agents.

In 1997 he was transferred to the Federal Ministry for Foreign Affairs and subsequently sent to the German Embassies in Athens and Stockholm as a Labour Attache'. He also served partly in Sarajewo, Belgrade (from Athens) and Helsinki (from Stockholm). Dublin was the next station where he joined in autumn 2001 the European Foundation for the Improvement of Living and Working Conditions, a tripartite administered European Agency, as a German National Expert seconded from the Federal Ministry for Economy and Labour. He advised the Directorate and worked also as a programme manager in the communications section. June 2004 led him to Pretoria where he held the position of Counsellor for Economics in the German Embassy until June 2008. Since July 2008 he is Deputy Head of Division International Labour and Social Policy in the Federal Ministry of Labour and Social Affairs.

Nacido en marzo de 1960, estudió biología en la Universidad Johann Wolfgang Goethe de Frankfurt, Alemania, y realizó un doctorado en Microbiología, Bioquímica y Genética Humana / Antropología. Desde 1988, trabajó durante 3 años como científico forense para la central de la Oficina de Policía Criminal del Estado Federado Hesse (LKA). En el verano de 1991 se unió al Departamento de Salud y Seguridad Laboral en el Ministerio de Trabajo y Asuntos Sociales de Bonn. Agregado laboral en las Embajadas Alemanas en Atenas y Estocolmo. Dublín fue su próxima parada, donde en 2001 se unió a la Fundación Europea para la Mejora de Condiciones de Vida y Trabajo, una agencia Europea con administración tripartita, como experto nacional de Alemania en comisión de servicio desde el Ministerio Federal de Economía y Trabajo. Asesoró a la dirección y también trabajó como gestor de programas en la sección de Comunicación.

Consejero de Economía en la Embajada Alemana en Pretoria hasta junio de 2008. Desde junio de 2008 es vicepresidente de la División Internacional de Trabajo y Políticas Sociales en el Ministerio Federal de Trabajo y Asuntos Sociales.
