Tip: Ai Weiwei in New York - Photographs from 1983 to 1993 in the Martin-Gropius-Bau

The Martin-Gropius-Bau is showing the first such exhibition in Germany of more than 220 photographs by the Chinese artist Ai Weiwei from the time when he was living in New York City, from 1983 to 1993. The artist himself curated the exhibition. Ai made more than 10,000 photos during the time he spent in N.Y. With his camera he documented his own life and artistic activities, his surroundings and the events of his era. The photographs give us a clear picture of the beginnings of Ai Weiwei's concept art and of the multifarious, stimulating and inspiring New York art scene of the 1980s.
